Palm Sunday

"I'm Loosed Because God Has Need of Me, NOW!"

Introduction

- Jesus Christ, the Savior, is here NOW to free you from every form of bondage and wants to demonstrate His glory in every area of your life. All you have to do is follow after Him as King of your life!
- **Hosanna** from the Hebrew: yasha`na' Save Now!
 - Psalm 118:24 26
 - **Matthew 21:1 11**

- o Mark 11:1 − 10
- o Luke 19:29 38
- John 12:12 15

Scripture Text & Message

Psalm 118:24-26 (KJV)

²⁴ This is the day which the LORD hath made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.

²⁵ Save now, I beseech thee, O LORD: O LORD, I beseech thee, send now prosperity.

²⁶ Blessed be he that cometh in the name of the LORD: we have blessed you out of the house of the LORD.

Matthew 21:1-11 (KJV)

- ¹ And when they drew nigh unto Jerusalem, and were come to Bethphage, unto the mount of Olives, then sent Jesus two disciples,
- ² Saying unto them, Go into the village over against you, and straightway ye shall find an ass tied, and a colt with her: loose them, and bring them unto me.
- God spoke deliverance from bondage over the mother [female donkey; ass] and her colt [young donkey child], even before the disciples arrived.
- ³ And if any man say ought unto you, ye shall say, The Lord hath need of them; and straightway he will send them.
 - **21:3** if anyone says anything to you. Mark recorded that his was in fact exactly what happened (Mark 11:5, 6). Having just arrived in Bethphage (v.), Jesus would have had no opportunity to make arrangements for the use of these animals. Yet He knew precisely the location of the animals and the disposition of the owners. Such detailed foreknowledge reveals His divine omniscience.
 - Jesus had need of both the mother and her colt. Jesus had already spoken to the heart of the owners and arranged for their deliverance, so there would be no struggle, stress, strain or conflict.
 - The colt had never been ridden and was especially suited for a holy purpose. (Luke 19:30)
 - Their purpose was to carry the Living Word of God into Jerusalem and introduce Jesus as Savior and King!
 - God had preordained this new innocent cult to a holy calling, mirroring the image of God and His only begotten son, pure and free from all sin.
 - How much more does God have planned and purposed for you!
- ⁴ All this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying,
- ⁵ Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass.
- ⁶ And the disciples went, and did as Jesus commanded them,
- And brought the ass, and the colt, and put on them their clothes, and they set him thereon.
 - **21:7** the donkey and the colt. Matthew is the only gospel writer who mentions the mare donkey. But all mention the young ages of the donkey (John 12:14), or state that no man had ever sat on him (Mark 11:2; Luke 19:30) the mare was brought along, possibly to induce the colt to cooperate. **set Him on them**. I.e, on the clothes. Christ rode on the young colt (Mark 11:7)
 - · God's Word goes forth and accomplished what it was sent and purposed to do.



⁸ And a very great multitude spread their garments in the way; others cut down branches from the trees, and strawed them in the way.

21:8 spread their cloths on the road. Spreading one's garments on the street was an ancient act of homage reserved for high royalty (cf. 2 King 9:13), suggesting that they recognized His claim to be King of the Jews.

⁹ And the multitudes that went before, and that followed, cried, saying, **Hosanna**^{G5614} to the son of David: Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord; **Hosanna**^{G5614} in the highest.

21:9 Hosanna. This transliterates the Hebrew expression which is translated "Save now" in Psalm 118:25. **Blessed is He**. This is an exact quotation from v.26 of the same psalm. This along with the messianic title "Son of David," makes it clear that the crowd was acknowledging Christ's messianic claim. The date of this entry was Sunday, 9 Nisan, A.D. 30, exactly 483 years after the decree of Artaxerxes mentioned in Daniel 9:24-26.

¹⁰ And when he was come into Jerusalem, all the city was moved, saying, Who is this?

Mark 11:1-10 (KJV)

11 And when they came nigh to Jerusalem, unto Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount of Olives, he sendeth forth two of his disciples,

² And saith unto them, Go your way into the village over against you: and as soon as ye be entered into it, ye shall find \underline{a} colt tied, whereon never man sat; loose him, and bring him.

¹¹ And the multitude said, This is Jesus the prophet of Nazareth of Galilee.

³ And if any man say unto you, Why do ye this? say ye that the Lord hath need of him; and straightway he will send him hither.

⁴ And they went their way, and found the colt tied by the door without in a place where two ways met; and they loose him.

⁵ And certain of them that stood there said unto them, What do ye, loosing the colt?



- ⁶ And they said unto them even as Jesus had commanded: and they let them go.
 - It doesn't matter what kind of trouble or bondage you are in or crossroad in life you are at, trying to decide which door to open in life.
 - If God has called you, then He has ordained and equipped you to carry out His calling! God equips you for His purpose!
 - Jesus Christ has come to save you NOW! Hosanna yasha` na' Save Now!
- ⁷ And they brought the colt to Jesus, and cast their garments on him; and he sat upon him.
- ⁸ And many spread their garments in the way: and others cut down branches off the trees, and strawed them in the way.
- ⁹ And they that went before, and they that followed, cried, saying, <u>Hosanna</u>; <u>Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord</u>:
- ¹⁰ Blessed be the kingdom of our father David, that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

Luke 19:29-38 (KJV)

- ²⁹ And it came to pass, when he was come nigh to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount called the mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples,
- ³⁰ Saying, Go ye into the village over against you; in the which at your entering <u>ye shall find a colt tied, whereon yet never man sat: loose him, and bring him hither.</u>
- ³¹ And if any man ask you, Why do ye loose him? thus shall ye say unto him, Because the Lord hath need of him.
- ³² And they that were sent went their way, and found even as he had said unto them.
- And as they were loosing the colt, the owners thereof said unto them, Why loose ye the colt?
- And they said, The Lord hath need of him.
- 35 And they brought him to Jesus: and they cast their garments upon the colt, and they set Jesus thereon.
- ³⁶ And as he went, they spread their clothes in the way.
- ³⁷ And when he was come nigh, even now at the descent of the mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen;
- ³⁸ Saying, Blessed be the King that cometh in the name of the Lord: peace in heaven, and glory in the highest.

John 12:12-16 (KJV)

- ¹² On the next day much people that were come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem,
- ¹³ Took branches of palm trees, and went forth to meet him, and cried, Hosanna: Blessed is the King of Israel that cometh in the name of the Lord.
- ¹⁴ And Jesus, when he had found a young ass, sat thereon; as it is written,
- ¹⁵ Fear not, daughter of Sion: behold, thy King cometh, sitting on an ass's colt.
- ¹⁶ These things understood not his disciples at the first: but when Jesus was glorified, then remembered they that these things were written of him, and that they had done these things unto him.

Conclusion

- Just as the time had come for God's purpose to be revealed through a young donkey and its mother, Jesus has come to deliver you every form of bondage because God has need of you NOW!
- NOW is time for you to walk out your God given purpose that glorifies the Father.
